Pavilion Area Information and Rules

The pavilion, which is located above the pond, is 26 feet square and covered with a metal roof. There are picnic tables and a stainless steel barbeque gas grill. Along with these amenities, there is electricity, ceiling fans, a sink and a hose bib on the outside. There is a fire pit and a horseshoe pit located adjacent to the pavilion.

Pavilion Rules:

- 1. Please keep the pavilion clean and be sure it is properly cleaned after use.
- 2. Be considerate of the homeowners who live adjacent to the pavilion.
- 3. After use of this facility, take any garbage to your own home for collection. There is no garbage collection at the pavilion.
- 4. Reservations for use of the pavilion will be on a first in, first served basis. Please contact Kings Point at 830-935-4050 or email contact@kingspointpoa.com to reserve your date.
- 5. Weekday events should end at 10:00 p.m. and weekend events at 12:00 a.m. midnight.
- 6. The sink is for handwashing only. Please do not use it for washing dishes.
- 7. After use of the grill, be sure to turn off the propane tank underneath.
- 8. Turn off all lights and fans upon leaving the pavilion.

Fishing Pond Area Information and Rules

We have a ramp to access our fishing dock; it's much safer and easier to go fishing.

- 1. This is your facility. Please help us to keep it clean. Be considerate of others.
- 2. No children under 16 left unattended without adult supervision.

Lake Area Information and Rules

- 1. There are parking spaces for approximately 4 cars below the dam. When you have finished dropping off supplies for your boat or picnic, please use the designated parking area; if it is full, use the upper common area or street for parking. Parking on the shore of the lake is prohibited by the Army Corps of Engineers.
- 2. According to the Corps of Engineers, the docking of boats on the shore line are allowed for 48 hours.

- 3. Please help us to keep the shoreline clean and be considerate of others.
- 4. Per the Texas Parks & Wildlife, a person taking or attempting to take game and nongame fish from fresh water for non-commercial purposes is required to have a valid fishing license and a freshwater fishing stamp endorsement.

Boating Tips

- 1. Always wear a life jacket. Nearly 85% of boating fatality victims were not wearing a life jacket.
- 2. Avoid alcohol. Alcohol plays a role in 50 percent of all boating accidents. Game Wardens enforce the Boating While Intoxicated (BWI) law. A person who either appears to be impaired and/or has a blood alcohol level of 0.08 or higher while operating a boat can be arrested for BWI. A person arrested for BWI may be jailed for up to 180 days, be fined as much as \$2,000 or both. Additionally, the person's drivers' license may be automatically suspended.
- 3. Be especially careful on personal watercrafts.
- 4. Children younger than age 13 must wear a Coast Guard approved life jacket while underway.
- 5. Don't overload your boat.
- 6. Operate at a safe speed.
- 7. Always have a passenger serve as a lookout in addition to the operator.
- 8. Watch out for low water areas or submerged objects.
